God's Glory -- Part 2

Revelation 15:5-8

- 1. The Glory during JOSHUA AND THE JUDGES 1 Samuel 4:21-22
- 2. The Glory during KING SOLOMONS REIGN 1 Kings 8:1-13; Ezekiel 9:3-11:23

Ezekiel, a prophet of God during the time when Israel was in captivity in Babylon saw how the SHECHINAH GLORY departed from Israel.

Stage One: Departure from the HOLY OF HOLIES

Ezekiel 9:3a

Stage Two: Departure from the OF THE DOOR OF THE TEMPLE

Ezekiel 10:4

Stage Three: Departure from the EASTERN GATE

Ezekiel 10:18-19

Stage Four: Departure from the MOUNT OF OLIVES

Ezekiel 11:22-23

After the Jews returned from Babylonian captivity, THE SECOND TEMPLE WAS BUILT.

Haggai 2:3-9

3. The Glory DURING THE NEW TESTAMENT TIME Luke 2:8-9; Matthew 2:1-12; John 1:1-14; Isaiah 9:2;

2 Corinthians 4:5-6; Hebrews 1:1-3; Isaiah 9:2

The greatest manifestation of the Shechinah Glory in the person of Christ is found in the transfiguration passages.

There are 4 passages where a description is given. Each passage gives a different description of what occurred, but all desribe the brilliance of the Shechinah Glory.

Matthew 17:1-8 Mark 9:2-8 Luke 9:28-36 2 Peter 1:16-18

The Shechinah Glory in the book of Acts

Acts 2:1-3; Acts 9:3-8; Acts 22:6-11; Acts 26:13-18

The last historic appearance of the Shechinah Glory was to the Apostle John in *Revelation 1:12-16*

Ephesians chapter One explains how we as followers of Christ are to reflect the Shechinah Glory.

In verse 6 the believer is to the praise of the glory of His grace.

In verse 12 the believer should be to the praise of His glory

In verse 14 the believer is unto the praise of His glory

In verse 18 the believer is the glory of His inheritance in the saints.

Summary:

In the New Testament, the appearance of the Shechinah Glory was primarily manifested in the person of Jesus Christ. He was the new visible manifestation of God's presence. Today, it is the obligation of the believer to reflect that glory.
